What Should Healthcare on Mayne Island Look Like in 5 years?

That question was put to 30 Mayne Islanders who attended a 3-hour meeting in preparation for the launch of a MIHCA Community Advisory Committee, which is an important piece in our strategic plan. We are very grateful to those generous and thoughtful people who participated.

While we are excited to be actively engaged in recruiting for a new full time Nurse Practitioner as well as an additional primary care physician (see our November MayneLiner article), there is more to be done. This group helped identify many of the enhancements we wish to see on Mayne. A few highlights of the many ideas include:

- Walk-in clinic services;
- Additional mental health care services;
- Additional lab services, to shorten wait times / lessen the need to go 'off island'.
- Preventative dental care;
- Post surgery care;
- Pre and post maternal care.

Equally important are the actions that we, as health care users, take to protect and enhance our own health. This includes being active socially, emotionally, and physically. While there are a great many opportunities on Mayne to be involved (just look at the many articles and advertisements in any issue of the MayneLiner), and the Mayne Island Assisted Living Society volunteers do a great job, there are still those who struggle to be active and involved. A challenge to us all is how to 'find' and engage those who find themselves alone. A challenge to anyone wishing to be more active and involved, is to reach out to a group that interests you and ask how you could be involved with them.
